MORNING PRAYER

Sunday 15 August 2021 Feast of Mary, Mother of our Lord

Welcome to this service of Morning Prayer, and thank you for joining us whether from near or far. Please add your voice and your prayers as we worship God together.

The service of **Morning Prayer** has its roots in the daily pattern of prayer and worship in monastic communities. The liturgy draws richly on the scriptures: both in the appointed psalms and readings, and also in other songs (canticles) and responses. Today's pew sheet (see www.anglicanaltlav.org.au/pew-sheets) contains a third reading, set for today but not included in this service.

This is the day that the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it.

Psalm 118.24

Glory to God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit: as in the beginning, so now, and for ever. Amen.

The Opening Canticle, A Song of God's Herald

Go up to a high mountain, herald of good tidings to Zion: lift up your voice with strength, herald of good tidings to Jerusalem.

Lift up your voice, fear not: say to the cities of Judah, 'Behold your God!'

See the Lord God, coming with power: coming to rule with his mighty arm.

He brings his reward for the people of God: the recompense for those who are saved.

God will feed his flock like a shepherd: and gather the lambs in his arms;

He will hold them to his breast: and gently lead those that are with young.

Isaiah 40.9-11

The Opening Prayer

our maker and our judge,
we have sinned against you
in thought, word, and deed,
and in what we have failed to do:
we have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves;
we repent, and are sorry for all our sins.
Father, forgive us.
Strengthen us to love and obey you
in newness of life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

May Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. **Amen.**

Psalm

Praise the Lord, O sing praises, you that are his servants: O praise the name of the Lord.

Let the name of the Lord be blessed: from this time forward and for ever.

From the rising of the sun to its going down: let the name of the Lord be praised.

The Lord is exalted over all the nations: and his glory is above the heavens.

Who can be likened to the Lord our God: in heaven or upon the earth,

Who has his dwelling so high: yet condescends to look on things beneath?

He raises the lowly from the dust: and lifts the poor from out of the dungheap;

He gives them a place among the princes: even among the princes of his people.

He causes the barren woman to keep house: and makes her a joyful mother of children. Praise the Lord.

From the rising of the sun to its setting we praise your name, O Lord; may your promise to raise the poor from the dust and turn the fortunes of the needy upside down be fulfilled in our time also, as it was in your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Reading from the First Testament (Hebrew Bible)

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah

'I surely rejoice in the LORD; my heart is joyful because of my God, because he has clothed me with clothes of victory, wrapped me in a robe of righteousness like a bridegroom in a priestly crown, and like a bride adorned in jewellery.

As the earth puts out its growth, and as a garden grows its seeds, so the LORD God will grow righteousness and praise before all the nations.

For Zion's sake I won't keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I won't sit still until her righteousness shines out like a light, and her salvation blazes like a torch.

Nations will see your righteousness, all kings your glory.

You will be called by a new name, which the LORD's own mouth will determine.

You will be a splendid garland in the LORD's hand, a royal turban in the palm of God's hand.'!"

Reading from the New Testament

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke

In those days Caesar Augustus declared that everyone throughout the empire should be enrolled in the tax lists. This first enrolment occurred when Quirinius governed Syria. Everyone went to their own cities to be enrolled. Since Joseph belonged to David's house

and family line, he went up from the city of Nazareth in Galilee to David's city, called Bethlehem, in Judea. He went to be enrolled together with Mary, who was promised to him in marriage and who was pregnant. While they were there, the time came for Mary to have her baby. She gave birth to her firstborn child, a son, wrapped him snugly, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the guestroom.

Here ends the second reading.

The readings are followed by a short period of silence for reflection, then the response

and bear much fruit to your glory.

The Canticle, The Song of Mary (Magnificat)

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord: my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour,

Who has looked with favour on his lowly servant: from this day all generations will call me blessed;

The Almighty has done great things for me: and holy is his name.

God has mercy on those who fear him: from generation to generation.

The Lord has shown strength with his arm: and scattered the proud in their conceit,

Casting down the mighty from their thrones: and lifting up the lowly.

God has filled the hungry with good things: and sent the rich away empty.

He has come to the aid of his servant Israel: to remember the promise of mercy,

The promise made to our forebears: to Abraham and his children for ever.'

The Apostles' Creed
